

BOLTON FILM FESTIVAL

A brief introduction to Bolton Film Festival from our patron the actress Maxine Peake...

"I'm delighted to be the patron of this event, it's been great to see the festival grow in stature since it's inception seven years ago. When I attended I was impressed by the scale and ambition of the festival, the size of its audiences and the warm welcome it offers its filmmakers. Short films are a format close to my heart, they have the ability to tell big stories in a short amount of time, it's always been a place to take risks and be bold and adventurous."





Zoe and I are delighted to welcome you to the eighth edition of Bolton International Film Festival, this year screening 300 short films including 34 World Premieres, 16 European Premieres and 65 National Premieres.

Among the films showcased are works featuring esteemed actors including Christopher Eccleston - known for his roles in "Doctor Who" and "The Leftovers." Freddie Fox - known for his roles in "White House Farm" and "The Three Musketeers." Mia Mckenna-Bruce (How to have sex) and Louisa Connolly-Burnham co-star in Sister Wives.

Michael Patrick Clarkson (Writer/Co-Creator Red Rose, BBC) features in the Made Up North programme on the opening evening of the film festival with his directorial debut and World Premiere of "Upholstergeist". A comedy/horror shot at Rivington Barn, "When a furniture repairer on a restoration TV show is

tasked with fixing a chair for a strange brother and sister, the job may cost more than just her time."

Oscar winners Chris Overton and Rachel Shenton (All Creatures Great and Small) return to Bolton with The Slick Films Pitch, a live competition where five film teams will pitch their projects to a panel of industry experts for a chance to win a £10,000 prize. Witness the tension and excitement as one team secures the grand prize, setting the stage for a transformative filmmaking and mentoring journey supported by Slick Films and industry partners.

This year's festival boasts an exceptional line up of speakers, including, Sean McAllister: BAFTA-nominated and Sundance-winning documentary filmmaker, known for pushing the boundaries of documentary filmmaking. Mick Audsley: Renowned British film and television editor with over thirty film credits, including The Personal History of David Copperfield, Murder on the Orient Express, Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire.

Jack Thomas-O'Brien (Producer, Sixteen Films) and Laura Carreira (Director) will share insights on overcoming the challenges of making Laura's debut feature On Falling, which premiered at the Venice Film Festival. Amy O'Hara: Film 4 Development Exec, will be in conversation with Grammy and Grierson award nominated filmmaker Dylan Southern. BBC Development Executive Simon Nelson will share advice on writing for film and television and developing compelling characters. Robin Shaw: Emmy, Annecy, and British Animation Award-winning animator, known for Mog's Christmas, which won the longform prize at the British Animation Awards. The BFI Network team join us with a showcase of films and a roundtable for filmmakers.

This short aims to show refugees' experiences of migration without dwelling on the horrors and instead reflect on their personal journeys of discovery.


